HELEN'S ART SHEETS

Have you ever finished a project and found little bits and pieces of clay lying all around your workspace? If you are like me, I ball them up and either make a mirror bead, or throw them in the scrap heap. But I stumbled onto another great way to use the scraps!

Art Sheets are made from bits and pieces, both scrap and created and I'll show you how on Sat at the meeting.

This project does not require any precise measurements so bring what you want of the following:

Supplies

1. Clay that will be your background color, I love to use pearl, but black or any color will do as well, just keep in mind that whatever your background color is you'll want contrast in

your bits and pieces. One block should be enough. Condition it to the thickest setting on the pasta machine.

2. Clay in various colors. Think in terms of a color palette. If your background is dark you will want lighter, brighter colors. But you need very little of any color so bring whatever inspires you.
3. Extruder, discs, decorative scissors (I will bring plenty to share), cutters (think small), punches, foils, mica powders, glitter- whatever strikes your fancy. We will be making strings, circles and various shapes to include in your art sheet. You can even use pieces or slices of canes.
4. Pasta machine.
5. A work surface, preferably a glass or ceramic tile.
6. An acrylic rod or brayer.
7. Blades and the usual stuff for working with clay.
8. Something to cover with your art sheet, might be a BOH or a small tin, or you can make jewelry out of it. My Mom wanted one just to frame as it is!
